The Greek word for 'looking' is a much fuller word than we can find in the English language. It has a preposition in which turns the look away from everything else. You are to look from all beside to Jesus. –C.H. Spurgeon

Fueled by Joy

We can choose joy when our perspective is right! Jesus endured with joy because He thought little of His suffering and more of the joy to come. Christ so believed in the weightiness of what was coming—glorification in Heaven.

Read Hebrews 11:13-16. We are pilgrims on this earth—living for another time and another place. How can the joys of heaven fuel our endurance today? (Psalm 16:11, 1 John 3:2, Matthew 25:21, Philippians 3:20-21)

It will be worth it all when we see Jesus! Life's trials will seem so small when we see Christ. One glimpse of His dear face, all sorrow will erase. So, bravely run the race till we see Christ!
